SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1. RULES

1.1 This regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the **2017 DRYA SPONSORING CLUBS AMENDED SAILING INSTRUCTIONS FOR "A" AND "C" COURSES**. Sailing Instructions may be located at drya.org/race2017/SIs/SailingInstructions.pdf
Racing rules 2, 6, 8, 9, and 15 are changed as follows:

2. ENTRIES - This regatta is open to boats owned by clubs, or members of clubs, holding current memberships in the DRYA and to sail yachts owned by members of the Grosse Pointe Sail Club that have registered with GPSC, by August 10, 2017, to compete in the GPSC Club JAM Class. Registration forms may be obtained from and submitted to xferry@sbcglobal.net.

PHRF handicaps for PHRF 1, PHRF 2, PHRF 3, PHRF 4, PHRFASM and PHRF Warhorse classes will be those assigned by the DRYA, 23915 Jefferson, Suite 1, St. Clair Shores, MI 48080 586.778.1000/ e-mail BarbSeskiDRYA@gmail.com Sailing Instructions are available on the GPSC web site in the Race section and on the DRYA web site.

6. CLASS FLAGS - Changed to include C-5-GPSC Club JAM Class, with the GPSC Burgee as Class Flag.

8. COURSES & MARKS - Changed to refer to the course descriptions and diagrams in these GPSC Sailing Instructions.

9. STARTING - Starts and courses sailed by each class will be as described below.

15. Time Limit – The time limit for each class is 4 hours after its starting signal or 1 hour after the finish of the 1st boat in each boats respective class.

A COURSE - First Warning Signal at 1030 hours.

Approximate course location: 42° 21.75' N, 82° 49.05' W. The starting area bears approximately 91° magnetic, 4.44 nm from Peche Island Range Rear light.

A COURSE IS A MODIFIED OLYMPIC TRIANGLE (see diagram)

The **DRYA Sailing Instructions for "A" Course** only shall apply with the exception of the paragraphs A4, A5, A7 and the course diagram shown below.

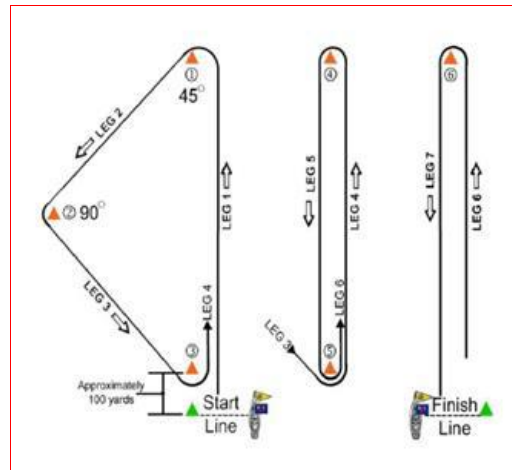
A4. FINISH LINE - Boats shall finish between a staff displaying a blue flag on the Race Committee boat at the starboard end and a green finish mark which shall be left to port. The leeward mark has no significance on the last leg of the course. The Finish Line will be located approximately 100 yards downwind of the leeward mark.

A5. COURSES - If the Starting Line Signal Boat displays numeric signal 7 before or with the warning signal for the start of the first class, boats will sail a modified Olympic course with seven legs (Start-1-2-3-1-3-1- Finish). Mark 2 is not a mark of the fifth or last leg of the course. If the Starting Line Signal Boat displays numeric signal 5 before or with the warning signal for the start of the first class, boats will sail a modified Olympic course with five legs (Start-1-2-3-1- Finish). Mark 2 is not a mark of the fifth leg of the course.

A7. NUMBER OF RACES – The Race Committee intends to run only one race. An optional Champagne Race will be held for all boats.

Boats are requested to monitor **VHF Channel 72** one hour prior to the race and one hour after the race.

MODIFIED OLYMPIC TRIANGLE COURSE



C COURSE - First Warning Signal at 1030 hours.

Approximate course location: 42° 22.15' N, 82° 52.00' W. The starting area bears approximately 075° magnetic, 2.4 nm from Peche Island Range Rear light.

The **DRYA Sailing Instructions for "C" Course Optional Modified Olympic Course** shall apply with the exception of paragraphs 3, 4 and the course diagram shown.

3. COURSE - C COURSE IS A MODIFIED OLYMPIC TRIANGLE (see diagram)

4. NUMBER OF RACES – The Race Committee intends to run only one race. An optional Champagne Race will be held for all boats.

Boats are requested to monitor **VHF Channel 71** one hour prior to the race and one hour after the race.

CHAMPAGNE RACE - The GPSC will also host an optional Champagne Race immediately following the finish of the regular Regatta. Boats wishing to participate shall hail the 'Windmill Pointe Finish Line' on channel 68 at any time after 1230 hours; declare their intention to participate; and sail directly from the GPSC Regatta finish to a finish line between the flagpole on the Windmill Pointe harbor and an orange pyramid approximately 180 degrees from the flagpole, keeping the Peche Island Range Rear Light to port. Boats participating in the Champagne Race shall not sail back through the GPSC Regatta finish line and shall not interfere in any way with boats that have not yet finished the GPSC Regatta. Boats shall be scored using their GPSC Regatta finish time and the time taken by the GPSC Windmill Pointe finish line committee. Scoring will be Time on Distance for the Champagne Race. Prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place (per course) at the GPSC Regatta party. Champagne recipients must be present to win.

AFTER THE REGATTA

The Grosse Pointe Sail Club cordially invites the skippers and crews of competing yachts, and their guests, to an informal gathering at Windmill Pointe Marina, Grosse Pointe Park after the regatta. There will be beverages, hot dogs and snacks available starting at 1530 hours for a nominal charge. Limited mooring available, please hail Channel 68 with intent.

Awards will be given for first, second and third place in each class at the GPSC Awards Party, held at the Tompkins Center at Windmill Pointe Park during the Annual GPSC Awards Party on Friday, November 3rd.
